Business Manager's Report

Work in the Local has been good for this time of the year. We saw an improvement for our man hours worked in 2015 over 2014 and our hope is that 2016 will get even better. There are a few outages and turnarounds getting underway and the work outlook for the rest of the Locals in Indiana is strong. It seems that the projections are solid for most of the Midwest for the next couple of years. While the stock market has been down for the past year, other economic indicators such as unemployment rates and new job creation have been very positive for a stronger overall economy. We know that not all of the proposed projects will get built but if most of them proceed there is a large concern over the ability to supply enough skilled construction craftsmen. The Bureau of Labor Statistics projects from 2014 to 2024 that construction will have the second largest percentage growth in employment and the largest numeric growth in employment of all industry sectors. They are projecting growth of almost 800,000 jobs.

Politics on the national level are starting to heat up with the beginning of some of the primaries. Statewide politics will be ramping up over the next several months and we will be providing information to keep you informed about the candidates and issues that most affect organized labor. The Indiana AFL-CIO has developed some new initiatives to drive the get out to vote efforts. Indiana was last in the country at voter participation in the last election although UA Members had a much higher than average participation rate. Unfortunately the job growth, wages, benefits and safety protections we have can be greatly affected by election results. It is vital that we are involved in this process and encourage and educate others about labors role in sustaining a strong middle class.

We have recently made some upgrades to the Local's website www.ualocal157.org. Included on the site under "union information" you may access the Plumbers and Pipefitters National Pension Fund website and get information for the Pipe Trades Health and Welfare Plan. There is a section for the IPT Pension Plan with the Summary Plan Description and a very useful section on frequently asked questions. There is a link to the new Training Center website which contains information for apprentices and also journeyman upgrade classes. You can also find information about the ISPTA/MCAI Substance Abuse Policy and a list of collection sites.

We will be having the Local's Easter Egg Hunt again this year for the kids on Saturday March 19th. This was a great event last year. If you are interested in helping out with the event please contact us at the main office.

I encourage everyone to vote on March 5th for your UA Convention Delegates.

We want to thank and congratulate all of the apprentices that competed in the Local's Apprenticeship Contest. I also want to thank those that served as judges and the Training Department for their hard work. We wish Cody Jacobs, David Carrell, Jordan Keller and Tyler Galey the best of luck at the state competition.

Business Agent's Report

As of this publication there are 232 Members actively seeking employment with 41 of them being Apprentices and 55 Members on travel jobs. For the month of November we dispatched 127 Journeymen and 25 Apprentices with 18 call back requests and 26 Members on travel calls. For the month of December we dispatched 90 Journeymen and 15 Apprentices with 10 call back requests and 4 Members on travel jobs. For the month of January we dispatched 88 Journeymen and 13 Apprentices with 26 call back requests and 22 Members to travel jobs.

Local work from September to date has remained slow but steady with quite a few smaller projects scattered across our jurisdiction, keeping a few Members busy. Our spring outages will be starting soon at Marathon, Merom and Cayuga. The Merom outages are tentatively scheduled for Unit 1 to be down April 1st to April 13th and Unit 2 to be down April 23rd to May 10th. There is a possibility that these outages could start sooner due to the unseasonably warm winter we are having. The Cayuga outages are tentatively scheduled for Unit 1 to be down April 1st to April 28th and Unit 2 to be down April 28th to May 22nd. I don't have hard numbers on manpower requirements at this time but more than likely they will be working a 6-10's plus schedule.

At the last Vermillion Rise meeting I was told there could be an announcement this month or at the March meeting concerning a sizeable project at the site. I'm not sure what or when they are going to build but I will keep you informed as the information becomes available. In the last few months I have secured work for several Members on travel jobs. Most, but not all jobs, are taking Combo Welder-Fitter pairs. If you are aware and interested in a travel opportunity let me know, I will try to get you out to work.

Good luck to everyone nominated for election to The United Association General Convention. Congratulations to our Apprentices, Dave Carrell, Cody Jacobs, Tyler Galey, and Jordan Keller who won their respective divisions in the Local 157 Apprentice Contest. Good luck to all of you in the State Competition at Local 136 in Evansville.

Financial Secretary Treasurer's Report

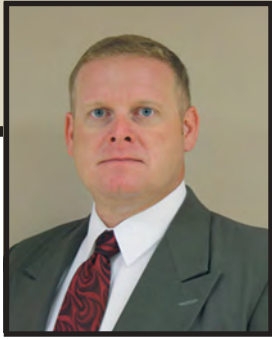
As you can see from this issue of our newsletter, we have an election for delegates to the 39th United Association General Convention coming up on Saturday March 5th. These conventions are held every 5 years and many important resolutions to amend the constitution that affect all affiliated local unions are discussed, debated, and voted on by delegates. Issues like raising union dues and the election of our General Officers will have a huge impact on the direction we take going into the future.

The number of delegates Local 157 is allowed is determined by sections 12 & 13 of the constitution which reads in part: The basis of representation of delegates to each convention shall be one delegate for each Local Union, provided that said Local Union shall not have less than twenty members in good standing during the fifth full month immediately preceding the month in which the convention is to be held, and one delegate for each additional one hundred members. For the purpose of determining the number of delegates to which a Local Union is entitled, only those members in good standing during the fifth full month immediately preceding the month in which the convention is to be held will be counted. The cash sheet of each Local Union for the fifth full month immediately preceding the month in which the convention is to be held shall be used to make this determination.

This all means that our total number of delegates could change, so it is important that we all pay our dues in a timely matter so that we don't lose any delegates before the processing of our March cash sheet.

We should never take "any" election of leaders that represent us lightly. Our delegates will be interacting with U.A. officers and representatives as well as other Local Union officers, members and staff. We have a responsibility to elect delegates that have an understanding of how our local union operates and how decisions made at the convention will affect our local and our members. They should represent us in a courteous and professional manner. We have several good candidates for delegate and we should give them our consideration and vote for those that we feel will best represent the members of Local 157.

Field Representative's Report Darrek Davis

Hopefully the worst of the winter season is behind us and the longer days are an indication spring is not far away. Our work has held its own this winter and not much has changed since my last article. The out of work list has not fluctuated much one way or the other for this time of year.

We continue to slowly send people to the REG Bio-Diesel Plant in Danville. Engineering issues has delayed reaching our peak manpower, but we expect them to continue to hire through spring.

The details of the spring turnaround at Marathon are being finalized and it looks like Morris will need approximately 110 people in addition to what is already onsite. They will be working 7 days a week for approximately 6 weeks. The fatigue policy will be implemented, however it has been agreed to that a persons required day off will not be on a premium time day (Saturday, Sunday). On this turnaround we will also see another first, Marathon is offering a completion bonus for all UA Members onsite, excluding firewatches. This will be a flat hourly rate for hours worked from March 7 - April 22. Pay out will be dependent on attendance and you must work until layoff and not be terminated or quit.

The 2016 Legislative Session of the Indiana General Assembly has been very quiet regarding issues involving organized labor. The majority of the short session has been consumed with education, road funding and civil rights issues. With the end of the session drawing near we must now focus our attention and efforts to the November elections. It is never too soon to start spreading the word that Indiana needs to get back on track by rebuilding the middle class people of Indiana and stop catering to big corporations and wasting time with the Republicans social agenda. And this rebuilding process can begin by electing John Gregg as Governor in November, but for this to happen we must get out and vote. We have to talk to friends, family and neighbors and encourage them to vote, we simply cannot do this alone!



Field Representative's Report Steve Snyder

Work in the Northern jurisdiction is starting to contract due to some larger projects reaching completion. This contraction should be short lived as the 2016 construction forecast looks promising.

The Subaru Paint Shop addition has been the main staple for Local 157 Members for the past several months. The major construction of the new addition has come to a close as startup and paint trials have officially started. Engineering errors and omissions continue to hamper these processes and have netted our contractors and Members additional man hours. I look for this to remain constant through the winter months into early spring. As I have reported before, talks have started about remodel and adding additional space to the newly built Paint Shop addition to the tune of 100 million plus dollars. Talks also included removal and retooling of the Toyota line, a new Body and Trim addition, and the stamping press removal and replacement. All of these projects added up equal around 3-4 years of solid work for our Members. It's great to have Subaru as a partner in Lafayette.

Purdue work continues with the two largest projects, Honors College and Active Learning Center getting underway. The Honors College is currently manned up and in full construction mode. This mild winter has not hampered Shambaugh & Son's progress on this job. Construction at the Active Learning Center is starting to open up. I have had several conversations with DA Dodd and the steward onsite about manpower projections. Right now hiring for this project should start shortly after the New Year. Purdue also announced a 40 million dollar addition to the MollenKauf Football Center for the 2016 year. This coupled with a 10 million dollar plus Betchel Learning Center, a 60 million dollar Large Animal Clinic, and several million dollars' worth of utility upgrades including High Pressure Steam and Chilled water piping are going to make 2016 a prosperous year for our Members.

I have continued with The Tippecanoe Building Trades along with other delegates to enhance Lafayette's Responsible Bidder Ordinance. We have officially submitted the paperwork to start the process. As some of you may know the current RBO lacks several key components to protect the taxpayer's investment. The IIIFC (Indiana, Illinois, and Iowa Fair Contracting) agency has been a tremendous help with the legal dealing and comparisons. I look forward to the spirited debate going forward.

As 2015 is now officially in the past, and we have completed our holiday obligations and celebrations, and while we commemorate material prosperity, let's not forget those who have not had the opportunities to achieve basic things that we take for granted. I encourage you to help those around you without those basic things whether they are your neighbor, brother or stranger.

I hope everyone had a Merry Christmas and I hope that everyone has a prosperous New Year.

Hope the Holidays went well for all of you and your families. Our apprentices were able to enjoy a short break but now it's time to get back to it.

A reminder to all the Illinois Plumbers (Journeyman and Apprentices) that renewal notices should be arriving in the early spring, expiration date is April 30th, 2016. Illinois Continuing Education will be held in Hutsonville on October 15th, 2016 at 8:00 am and October 26th, 2016 at 6:00 pm in Danville. There is no need to register ahead of time.

I hope that all Indiana Journeyman Licensed Plumbers have renewed their licenses. If not, it's not too late you can still renew you will just have to pay a late fee. If you have questions or concerns the phone number to the Indiana Plumbing Commissions is (317) 234-8800. For those of you who have already renewed please make sure to contact the training center so that we can keep your records up to date.

Future journeyman upgrade classes will be posted on the following websites ualocal157.org or 157trainingcenter.org. Through these websites you can register for classes, print continuity papers, check class schedules and obtain information about how to apply to the apprenticeship.

We recently held a "Signal Person" class in Terre Haute. 10 of our Members attended with 9 passing. This class is accredited by a third party test affiliate National Commission for the Certification of Crane Operators. The signal person certification is a 16 hour class. Third party testing is getting to be a major part of our certification process.

We now deal with National – Inspection – Testing – Certification (NITC) for Med Gas, Electrical Power Research Institute (EPRI) for Rigging and National Commission for the Certification of Crain Operators (NCCCO) for Signaling.

Representing Local 157 in the State Competition will be Cody Jacobs, Jordan Keller, Tyler Galey and David Carrell. We wish them the best of luck!
