In the event of a tie for any office, a run-off election will take place on the next Saturday, December 14th, at the same four (4) voting locations; between the hours of 7:30 am and 4:30 pm, Indiana Time.

Nominations will be conducted for each Office separately and any member nominated for an Office must be present to accept the nomination; or have a written statement on file with the Local 157 Recording Secretary stating the Office which is acceptable and their willingness to run for election to that Office. The statement must also include the reason for not being able to accept the nomination in person.

No Member who directly or indirectly owns, operates or holds stock in a plumbing, pipefitting, HVAC, or other related business employing Local 157 Members may hold an Elected Office.

## Business Agent's Report

### *Wilbur E. "Webb" Crouch III*

As of this publication there are 133 journeymen and 31 apprentices actively seeking employment with 94 journeymen and 8 apprentices on travel jobs. For the month of July we dispatched 85 journeymen and 35 apprentices with 21 call backs and 37 members to travel jobs. For the month of August we dispatched 83 journeymen and 31 apprentices with 4 call backs and 55 members to travel jobs.

I haven't received word of any announcements concerning the fertilizer plants at S&G Solutions or Tuscola. I will keep you informed when more information is available.

B&S Plumbing won the bid for the Green Homes at the Danville VA and will be roughing in 24 apartments soon. Pipeworks won the bid for the underground on the mental health facility at the Danville VA and have already started the job. They may hire one or two Illinois Licensed Plumbers in a few weeks.

There are a few short term projects at Elanco, Dupont, Taghleef and Steel Dynamics currently underway. In the next few weeks Freitag will be hiring approximately 10 pipefitters for a 3 week job at Dupont. There are also nursing homes in Rockville and Linton that are currently out for bid.

Morris has manned up at Marathon and should be busy until November. They will have a small lay off and then will be hiring again in February or March for the spring turnaround which will take approximately 100 pipefitters.

Fluor Construction has taken over the maintenance at Newton Powerhouse. They will have an outage in March that will require 20 pipefitters for 7 weeks of 6-10's. They will be replacing high energy piping and coal piping and will need hot welders and heavy riggers.

It was great to see you all at this year's picnic! Thank you to everyone who attended and all of those who worked hard to make it a success.



## Financial Secretary Treasurer's Report

Since my last article the weather has somewhat lined out and I believe everyone was finally able to enjoy the summer.

The last month the office has been devoted to Labor Day activities in Terre Haute, Danville and Palestine, as well as Labor's Day in the Park in Lafayette. By all accounts they were all well attended.

The last several years I have been in charge of the bean dinner at Fairbanks Park in Terre Haute. The dinner follows our parade. This year was one of our biggest ever. Local 157 along with other members of the Central Wabash Valley Building & Construction Trades Council hosted hundreds for the beans, hot dogs, ice cream as well as a bounce house and pony rides. The event concluded with a dozen or more politicians speaking. Some local as well as some either in or running for state offices. We were able to hear from Dr. Woody Myers. They include Indiana American Water Company, Waste Water Treatment Plant and Industrial Supply in Terre Haute and Senex in Robinson, Illinois. Gas Distribution for Indiana, Kentucky and 6 counties in Illinois. To date we have successfully negotiated 6 separate contracts in the last 3 years. This month a new 2 year contract with the City of Terre Haute for our members at the Waste Water Treatment Plan was finalized. Luckily we have enjoyed a good rapport with our city leaders. They seem to truly appreciate their workforce, and honestly everyone I have dealt with seems to have genuine care for their employees. Making talk so much easier.

Gas Distribution continues to grow in our jurisdiction. The last month I signed up several new members, as well as a new contractor, Northern Pipeline doing work in the Kokomo, Indiana area.

## Field Representative's Report

Work in our Northern territories continues to forge ahead. We have multiple job openings requiring licensed plumbers, pipefitters and apprentices. In short if you need or want a job please call the Lafayette office at (765) 477-7092.

Many of the high profile projects at Purdue are in full construction mode. The \$65 million dollar STEM Building, the \$80 million dollar Agriculture Biological Engineering Building, the \$100 million plus P3 New

Dormitory Buildings, the remodel of Hillenbrand Hall Dorm and the multi-million dollar Convergence Building are just a few projects that are currently in the peak of the construction

phase. The \$80 million dollar Purdue Memorial Union Hotel renovation was awarded to Quality Plumbing and Heating. I had a chance for a site visit with General Foreman Jason Breymer to go over manpower requirements and the schedule. This project is fast paced and should keep many of our members busy in the months ahead.

The \$37 million dollar SABB Manufacturing facility in Purdue's Discovery Park is still in the design/build phase as several of our contractors have been contacted for their services. No timeline has been released yet for this project.

The Industrial work in the area remains robust. We still have crews working throughout the region at various facilities. As the labor crunch starts to worsen for these facilities and with recent retirements and companies ridged "non-replacement/training" policy our work in these areas will continue to increase in the months and years ahead. Evoniks Tippy Lab continues to schedule maintenance and turn around work. We have one of the largest crews in recent history currently performing these tasks at the plant. While the workload at this facility has leveled off I expect more work as the end of the year nears. I did have a chance to meet the new Maintenance Manager with Evoniks Chip Cotterman at the Tippecanoe Building Trades Council meeting. We discussed the upcoming workload and had a general introduction meeting with all the interested trade partners.

The \$25 million dollar Loeb Stadium renovation has been bid and awarded to DA Dodd. Construction has started due to the early ending of the baseball season. I expect plumbing crews to be on site by the end of September. The new multi-million penguin exhibit is well under construction as Shambaugh and Son is making good progress. These two projects are funded 100% by the City of Lafayette and will revitalize the Park Avenue neighborhood in Lafayette.

In closing I want to thank everyone who participated in Labor Day at the Park. We had a tremendous turn-out this year. It was great to see everyone and their families again.

The 2019-2020 school year has officially kicked off with meetings involving Instructors, our returning and first year apprentices. These meetings took place during the week of August 19th - 23rd at the Lafayette and Terre Haute campuses. There were 50+ incoming apprentices that attended the orientation on August 20th and 100+ returning apprentices that attended the orientation on August 22nd. These apprentices were introduced to documents pertaining to their obligations while being in the apprenticeship program as well as a question and answer time.

Prior to the apprentice meetings; the application process started. Applications were taken online at [157trainingcenter.org](http://157trainingcenter.org) from May 1, 2018 thru January 1, 2019. From there, the applicants are scheduled for WorkKeys testing where they must meet our pre-requisite scores to make it to the first round of interviews. There were 79 applicants that met our scores and were invited to the first interviews. The first interviews were held in May. These applicants go through an intense interview, where all are scored and ranked to figure out who makes it to a second interview. After tabulating the scores, the invitations for the second round were mailed out to 52 applicants. The second interviews were held in July. The scores from the second interview are presented to the JATC and final determination to accept 42 applicants into the apprenticeship program was made by them.

The apprentice classes started on August 26th. Current classes are OSHA 30, Safe Shop, Welding 2 and 3, Instrumentation and Industrial Rigging. Thank you to all the Instructors who are helping to teach our apprentices.

This is the renewal time for our Indiana Licensed Plumbers, upon renewal please inform the training department so that your records can be updated.

During the months of June and July 2019 your Health & Welfare Plan staff processed 15,738 claims, totaling \$5,810,118.13.

I would like to take this time to answer a few frequently asked questions regarding the new HRA (Health Reimbursement Account) benefit Local 157 implemented for its active members effective July 1, 2019.

- Will we receive a Debit Card to use for co-insurances and deductibles?** Not at this time. When distributions from accounts begin on July 1, 2020, A participant must first pay the balances due then submit a claim for reimbursement. To file a claim for reimbursement, the claims (co-insurances/deductibles paid) must total \$200. The participant can submit multiple medical bills with evidence of payment to reach the \$200. All claims must be filed within six months of the date the expense was incurred. The participants must be eligible for the Health & Welfare to be eligible for reimbursements from the HRA and have a balance in their HRA.
- Do we have to use the money in the account by the end of each year?** No. The contributions made on behalf of a participant can be carried over each year unless termination of coverage from the Plan and no activity (Employer contributions or claim reimbursements) for a period of 36 months or Death of the participant with no surviving dependents. At that time, any balance in the HRA will be forfeited.
- Can we use the HRA for self-payments?** Yes. Participants must have been eligible the preceding month to use the HRA for self-payments. Upon receiving the self-payment notice, the participant must contact the Fund Office to request a transfer form.
- Is the member the only one covered under the HRA?** No. Anyone eligible as a dependent under the participant's Health & Welfare is covered under the HRA.
- How will we know the balance of the HRA account?** Participants will be sent an annual statement in the first quarter of each Plan Year disclosing the activity posted to their HRA account as of the end of the prior Plan Year. You may also contact the fund office at any time for a balance of reported contributions.

Please refer to the Summary Material Modification sent out in May of 2019 for additional information regarding your HRA. You may access a copy of the Summary Plan Document and the latest Summary Material Modification on the Plan's website at **www.pthwplan.org**. Please contact the fund office should you have any questions.

## Labor-Management Reporting and Disclosure Act of 1959, As Amended

Title V - Safeguards for Labor Organizations Prohibition Against Certain Persons Holding Office (29 U.S.C. 504)

Sec. 504. (a) No person who is or has been a member of the Communist Party\* or who has been convicted of, or served any part of a prison term resulting from his conviction of, robbery, bribery, extortion, embezzlement, grand larceny, burglary, arson, violation of narcotics laws, murder, rape, assault with intent to kill, assault which inflicts grievous bodily injury, or a violation of title II or III of this Act, any felony involving abuse or misuse of such person's position or employment in a labor organization or employee benefit plan to seek or obtain an illegal gain at the expense of the members of the labor organization or the beneficiaries of the employee benefit plan, or conspiracy to commit any such crimes or attempt to commit any such crimes, or a crime in which any of the foregoing crimes is an element, shall serve or be permitted to serve—

(1) as a consultant or adviser to any labor organization,

(2) as an officer, director, trustee, member of any executive board or similar governing body, business agent, manager, organizer, employee, or representative in any capacity of any Labor organization,

(3) as a labor relations consultant or adviser to a person engaged in an industry or activity affecting commerce, or as an officer, director, agent, or employee of any group or association of employers dealing with any labor organization, or in a position having specific collective bargaining authority or direct responsibility in the area of labor-management relations in any corporation or association engaged in an industry or activity affecting commerce, or

(4) in a position which entitles its occupant to a share of the proceeds of, or as an officer or executive or administrative employee of, any entity whose activities are in whole or substantial part devoted to providing goods or services to any labor organization, or

(5) in any capacity, other than in his capacity as a member of such labor organization, that involves decisionmaking authority concerning, or decisionmaking authority over, or custody of, or control of the moneys, funds, assets, or property of any labor organization,

during or for the period of thirteen years after such conviction or after the end of such imprisonment, whichever is later, unless the sentencing court on the motion of the person convicted sets a lesser period of at least three years after such conviction or after the end of such imprisonment, whichever is later, or unless prior to the end of such period, in the case of a person so convicted or imprisoned, (A) his citizenship rights, having been revoked as a result of such conviction, have been fully restored, or (B) if the offense is a Federal offense, the sentencing judge or, if the offense is a State or local offense, the United States district court for the district in which the offense was committed, pursuant to sentencing guidelines and policy statements under section 994(a) of title 28, United States Code, determines that such person's service in any capacity referred to in clauses (1) through (5) would not be contrary to the purposes of this Act. Prior to making any such determination the court shall hold a hearing and shall give notice of such proceeding by certified mail to the Secretary of Labor and to State, county, and Federal prosecuting officials in the jurisdiction or jurisdictions in which such person was convicted. The court's determination in any such proceeding shall be final. No person shall knowingly hire, retain, employ, or otherwise place any other person to serve in any capacity in violation of this subsection.

(b) Any person who willfully violates this section shall be fined not more than \$10,000 or imprisoned for not more than five years, or both.

(c) For the purpose of this section—

(1) A person shall be deemed to have been "convicted" and under the disability of "conviction" from the date of the judgment of the trial court, regardless of whether that judgment remains under appeal.

(2) A period of parole shall not be considered as part of a period of imprisonment.

(d) Whenever any person—

(1) by operation of this section, has been barred from office or other position in a labor organization as a result of a conviction, and

(2) has filed an appeal of that conviction,

any salary which would be otherwise due such person by virtue of such office or position, shall be placed in escrow by the individual employer or organization responsible for payment of such salary. Payment of such salary into escrow shall continue for the duration of the appeal or for the period of time during which such salary would be otherwise due, whichever period is shorter. Upon the final reversal of such person's conviction on appeal, the amounts in escrow shall be paid to such person. Upon the final sustaining of such person's conviction on appeal, the amounts in escrow shall be returned to the individual employer or organization responsible for payments of those amounts. Upon final reversal of such person's conviction, such person shall no longer be barred by this statute from assuming any position from which such person was previously barred.

\* The U.S. Supreme Court on June 7, 1965, held unconstitutional as a bill of attainder the section 504 provision which imposes criminal sanctions on Communist Party members for holding union office (U.S. v. Brown, 381 U.S. 437, 85 S. Ct. 1707).
