As of this publication there are 180 journeymen and 38 apprentices actively seeking employment with 122 journeymen and 23 apprentices working on travel jobs. For the month of November, we dispatched 73 journeymen and 21 apprentices with 13 call backs and 42 members to travel jobs. For the month of December, we dispatched 45 journeymen and 10 apprentices with 9 call backs and 30 members to travel jobs.

Even though 2020 is behind us, the pandemic is not, causing more questions than answers at this point. The job market is very unstable right now and most of our projects are on hold due to the financial impact that Covid-19 has caused and the uncertainty of when the vaccine will be administered to the general public.

At this time, I will hold off on giving a Local work forecast until better information comes available to me.

There are still a few locals currently taking travelers. I will be robo texting these jobs out to you. If you are interested give me a call at the Terre Haute office.

## Field Representative's Report

The work outlook for the Northern Region still looks positive and encouraging. The simple activity of tracking development and design both conceptual and in process projects has been more difficult due to the mass amount of apprehension and uncertainty in today's new normal. Of course, I am speaking of the impacts from COVID-19 which have not been fully felt as of yet to our professional construction Industry. We are not out of the woods yet but things are definitely starting to look up.

We still have several projects at Purdue University that are on-going that should last throughout the winter. These projects include the Veterinarian Pathology building, Data Science building, Hagel Hall (Band and Orchestra) building and several lab renovations. At this time there are 8 projects that are scheduled to bid on Jan 21st. Several of these projects are back logged from last year's construction plans. As always, this area will have a high demand for Licensed Plumbers, Med Gas Certified and Brazing qualified members to complete these projects. If you are an apprentice and are shy on your OTJ training hours and have the means and methods to work in the Greater Lafayette area please don't hesitate to call the Lafayette office.

West Lafayette and Lafayette continue to make progress on capitol improvement projects throughout the region. The West Lafayette Library expansion is still tracking for a 2021 spring kick off. I was informed that QPH has this expansion project. The \$40 million Lafayette Police Station is still in the works with a 60-day moratorium on the demolition of a historical structure that is inside the new foot print of the proposed new building. This is just a formality and should not delay construction and ground breaking. The West Lafayette new Fitness Facility is scheduled to open in the coming weeks putting an end to a very large construction project. This opening has been delayed due to the recent COVID-19 resurgence in this area. I anticipate the ribbon cutting to be this Spring. These projects along with several surrounding educational projects including the Harrison High school addition and Greater Lafayette Career Academy addition should keep us busy throughout the winter and into early spring.

In closing I want to express my excitement and gratitude to President Elect Joe Biden. As many should know by the time you are reading this President Elect Biden has appointed a past President of Laborers Local 223, who is also the past President of Boston Building Trades who has also served in the Massachusetts House of Representatives and is the current Mayor of Boston to be the new Secretary of Labor of the United States. This momentous appointment has sent a clear message to the National Association of Building Trades Unions. That message is unmistakably saying that the tide has turned and we are no longer on the defensive from administrations that are self-centered. Going forward we will be on the offense with an administration of another center that will help us build up our ranks and expand the middle class of our great nation.

During the months of October and November 2020 your Health & Welfare Plan staff processed 16,330 claims, totaling \$5,686,920.90.

With the availability of the COVID-19 vaccination to the general population right around the corner, I would like to remind you that the Plan will cover COVID-19 vaccinations that have emergency use authorization (EUA) or are approved by the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) and recommended by the Centers For Disease Control at no cost to the Eligible Employee or their Eligible Dependents whether the vaccine is administered in a medical provider setting or retail pharmacy for the duration of the public health emergency. I would also like to remind you of a couple other benefits offered by the plan to all eligible insureds. The influenza, pneumonia and shingles vaccinations are covered at 100% as part of your Wellness Benefits.

If your physician administers these vaccinations in their office, you will need to make sure they submit the claim to Anthem BCBS. If you receive these vaccinations at a local pharmacy, you will need to give them your Sav-Rx prescription card. There should be no charge to you either way, so please contact the office should they try to collect a fee from you. Do not forget about the FREE and easy to use LiveHealth Online service your plan offers all eligible members and dependents not entitled to Medicare or other primary group coverage. The service is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year and can be accessed from any smartphone or computer with webcam capabilities. You will find the app in your smartphone's App Store. As with the vaccinations, if you should be charged for your LiveHealth visit, please contact this office so that we may assist you.

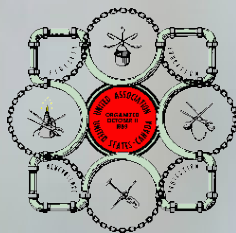
### 3) Start a Session

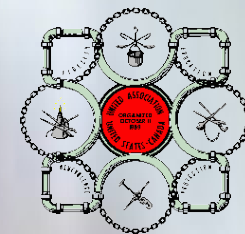
