Business Agent's Report

Stephen A. Snyder



Design, budgeting and material procurement continue to shape the 2023 Construction forecast across our Northern Jurisdictional region.

The semi-conductor plant being proposed by Sky-Water tech \$1.8 billion dollar investment still is the hottest topic on everyone's agenda. This \$1.8 billion dollar investment with over 100,000 square feet of clean room space packed into a 600K square foot facility located north of West Lafayette on 400 hundred acres of land at Purdue Discovery Park District will be a landscape changer for Local 157 for decades to come. The process of securing federal dollars from the CHIPS Act is still moving forward with a high favorability of success.

I had a meeting with West Lafayette economic development director and Mayor to discuss what we can accomplish with assisting the securing of federal dollars for this project. I discussed past work experience, training and governmental security clearance of our skilled labor force and how we can partner together to achieve success. The conversation was positive and encouraging.

The Sisters of Saint Francis \$43 million dollar Cancer Center has started. DA Dodd was the successful bidder. The structure steel is still being erected with dry-in a few weeks out. Saint Vincent Hospital has announced a \$25 Million dollar regional hospital located in West Lafayette. Ground breaking is not scheduled until the 2nd quarter of 2023. This new neighborhood hospital will serve the Areo-Space complex and the population growth in that area.

The 40-acre site \$60 million dollar new Klondike Middle School is moving forward despite supply delays. Commercial Air is the successful contractor for this job. Labor loading is slowly moving forward as the project thaws out from the deep freeze we experienced recently. A heavy demand for Indiana State License Plumbers will be needed to bring this project in on time. U/G plumbing is underway with the building envelop still several weeks out. Mayflower Mill Middle School renovation across the river is tracking well as Commercial Air continues to lead the charge on these school projects.

NUCOR Steel is still in the design stages for the \$290 million dollar expansion. Budgeting for waste water and underground piping has started for this Crawfordsville location. Nothing has changed or progressed with this and is still going forward as a planned in-house engineered, multi-bid packs project which is still scheduled for 3rd quarter of 2023. I will keep things updated as things progress.

Skanska Contractors 3 month project at Arconic reached its 14 month duration last week. This new waste water treatment plant has finally reached substantial completion. Punchlist and valve tagging are all that is left to complete.

Evonik at Tippy Labs in Lafayette continues to award process changes to Freitag Weinhardt. Our Local 157 Contractors continue to serve and execute more and more critical work as the reality of the availability of skilled trades personnel continue to work in our favor. This arrangement is still very fluid and talks for 2023 maintenance are ongoing. All is not lost and I am optimistic that we will continue to be a tier one supplier to our contractors on this site for years to come. The planned \$200 million dollar new processing facility is still in design with a start date of 2nd quarter of 2023.

The \$50 million dollar Hypersonic Lab project at Purdue's Areo Space complex winding down with minor equipment and material delays. Rolls Royce is continuing to design its announced \$200 million dollar expansion for the 1st quarter of 2023 with preliminary work underway. HMH Contractors is leading the charge on this project. Zucrow Labs jet propulsion \$73 million dollar expansion bid packages have been awarded. It appears that Freitag was the apparent low on the mech. package with DA Dodd being awarded the plumbing package. Specialty piping package has been released with one of our contractors listed as the apparent low bidder. A notice to proceed has yet to be issued. The ground breaking is still scheduled for 1st quarter of 2023. Schleman Hall continues with its \$53 million dollar renovation with bid package #2 being awarded to DA Dodd with a fast-track start date. Last October Purdue Athletics announced a \$45 million dollar renovation to Ross-Aide Stadium in 2023 and just last week announced \$45 million expansion for Purdue's airport.

We will need a large number of licensed plumbers, orbital welders, tube benders, detailers, heavy riggers and skilled pipefitters to deliver these projects on time and under budget. I encourage all members to use our training center to the fullest to skill up for these projects.

In closing, I want to thank everyone for the support from our most recent election. By the time you will be reading this I will have been sworn in as the Business Agent of Local 157. I am beyond humble and elated to serve our local in this capacity. The phone calls and messages of support have been nonstop. I look forward to working with all of our elected officials and contractors going forward. The education and data collection process has already started with assessments being made for each county in our jurisdiction. Knowledge is power and will be key to success. Also please do your due diligence to talk about our trade and what it has provided for you and your family to anyone willing to listen. You are our best advertisement for our apprenticeship program. Over the last 6 weeks I've worked closely with Steve Snyder and the office staff in Terre Haute. I've quickly learned that dispatching and the day to day operations are far from a typical work week. Patti, Stephanie, Joran and Georgie just to name a few, do more than we'll ever know to make 157 tick. I greatly appreciate the opportunity Mark Swaner and Local 157 has given me and I will work tirelessly to earn it.

Work in the Northern region is typical for the middle of winter. Many projects have been slowed due to the cold temps and muddy conditions moving dirt. Pepper construction has landed on site for the new Zucrow Labs at Purdue University. This will produce work for stainless welders along with fitters and plumbers. Pepper is keeping tight lipped on their contracts but we have been told that the plumbing and mechanical have both went Union. Commercial Air continues to move along with the new Klondike Middle School. It is a huge addition to West Lafayette and will be adding more plumbers and apprentices this spring. Subaru continues to stay busy as a new addition to the West side of the plant in trim and final was awarded to HMH. A. Hattersley as well as Newjac are keeping crews busy at Subaru and Arconic. Lafayette continues to stay busy with crews at IU Hospital, Franciscan Health's new Cancer Center and Purdue University. As always anyone with a plumbing license, med gas or welding certs will stay at a high premium. Steve Snyder and I were able to attend the Danville Area Labor Council meeting this month and made a lot of good contacts. We were able to meet with new State Senator Paul Ferochi and Danville Mayor Rickey Williams Jr. We look forward to 157 having a seat at the table on these committees in Illinois. While in Illinois we visited the new Casino and several other Danville area projects.

Travel work is on the brink of one of the biggest booms we've ever seen in the UA. I've sent hands all over the nation in the last several weeks. Local 440 continues to call daily for a large project at the downtown Eli Lilly location and Local 553 Wood River will be taking between 200-250 hands in the month of February. The 553 agent reports that the outage will work 7-12s on 2 shifts for 8-10 weeks. Anyone interested in travel position give me a call.

Gas Distribution Division

Year End Review

During the last 12 months there has been a lot of changes happening in the Gas Distribution Division. During Jan/Feb the Local 157 Gas Distribution team had many conversations and meetings with CenterPoint Energy. Which in return we were able to form a great relationship with CenterPoint Energy. This allowed us to be the first Local in over 50 years to be granted access into a utility companies manuals and be listed as a 3rd party contractor on the CenterPoint Energy website. With this blessing from CenterPoint Energy it allowed Local 157 to start the process to have the capabilities to qualify our Local 157 Brothers and Sisters.

During the months of Mar/Apr/May Local 157 Instructor Josh Sullivan was able to become a Certified (MEA) Midwest Energy Association (OQ) Operator Qualified Proctor/Evaluator. This along with continuing education classes and Train the Evaluator classes from CenterPoint Energy it is allowing Local 157 to get one step closer to having well trained Operator Qualified members in the field working.

Jun/Jul - We continued work on (TNG's) Computer based Training (KNT's) Computer based Knowledge Testing and (PEF's) Performance Evaluations. Work began on an (MOU) Memorandum of Understanding for all of our Signatory Gas Distribution Contractors. Local 157 worked diligently with the Signatory Contractors to agree on an understanding that will not only benefit Local 157 but also the Contractors. The month of July was exciting for Local 157 as we were able to hire Josh Sullivan as a Full time OQ Evaluator/Trainer.

Aug/Sept/Oct - During these months Tom Gofourth and Josh Sullivan were able to start setting up the Local 157 Gas Distribution training lab for Re-lighter and OQ training. Meetings continued with our Signatory Contractors regarding the signing of the MOU. Hydaker-Wheatlake signed the MOU in October, allowing us the opportunity to have Brother Nathan Perry be the first Operator Qualified member to come through the Gas Distribution Re-lighter training program. With this it will allow us to train many more Local 157 Gas Distribution members.

Nov/Dec- Work was started on a Black Board Gas Distribution Basic related math class and Re-lighter curriculum. Continued working with the UA to add Gas Distribution Pipefitter curriculum to the UAOLR. Towards the end of December, we finalized documentation with (EWN) Energy World Net for our Gas Distribution Trainer Josh Sullivan to become a Certified OQ trainer through them. This is going to allow Local 157 the great opportunity to reach many more utility companies in our jurisdiction.

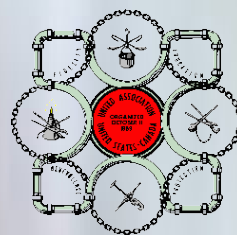

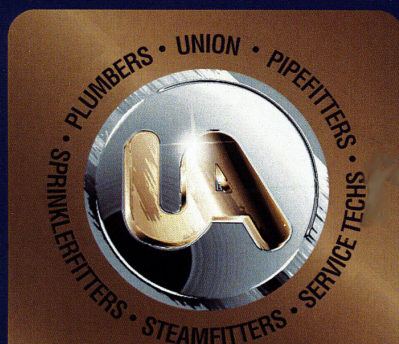
