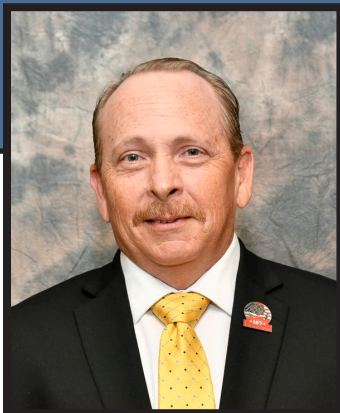
This year we brought in the largest apprenticeship class in Local 157 History. With all the upcoming work the need will be great.

I would like to start out by congratulating Mark Swaner on his retirement with over 40 years of service in this trade, the hours you have worked the miles you have traveled and dedication to this Local is an example that I hope our younger generation takes heed to. The last few months have been extremely busy for everyone in the office with training and help from Mark, Patti, Joran, Georgie and all the Business Managers, Business Agents and Field Reps reaching out to us and offering a hand and advice.

Thanks to our members for the support and courage you all have given to the newly elected and appointed Officers I'm looking forward to a smooth transition. Thank you to Adam Bennett and Matt Melin for doing the interview that was put on social media, you both represented our Local very well.

As the new Business Manager I know there is a lot of issues that needs to be worked on, they won't happen overnight. One of the first items that will be coming to our membership in the very near future will be DocuSign. Our referrals that we all have been handed on the job site to sign will now be done electronically to help eliminate the cost and waste of paper. With that being said our members need to make sure that we have all of your contact information up to date. The Officers and myself are looking forward to bringing more technology to our membership and our training center. I will also promise you that you will see the B.A., Field Rep and myself doing more job site visits. Jon and Adam have been to a number of jobs and meetings through out our jurisdiction with the General Contractors and our members to try and help gain back the relations needed to make the jobs a success.

At the time of this publication Entek and Clayco will have signed a PLA (Project Labor Agreement) for the battery components plant in southern Vigo County with an estimated cost of 1.2 billion and slated to start production in 2027. Wabash Vally Resources will announce in August of 2024 who the GC will be for the 1-billion-dollar project and work scheduled for February of 2025. Representatives of WVR say that the existing size of the plant is only about 40%, a lot of this will need to be refurbished the other 60% of the facility will be new construction and is also slated for a 2027 start up date. These two projects alone will take an approximate 300 to 500 Local 157 members. In 2025 Marathon will be needing 200 of our members for the upcoming work. Duke Energy at Cayuga Indiana is looking at a multibillion-dollar project starting this fall. The Lafayette area as always is very busy and is in need of man power, please call Jon or Adam to find out what skills the contractors are needing to fill their jobs. I'm looking forward to bringing our members travelling back home.

To our incoming class of Apprentices, congratulations on being a part of a brotherhood that will help and support you. I'm proud to say that this is the largest class in the history of our Local, we will be bringing in over 160 new members. We have had over 200 apply for this summer's AWP class, of course we could not accept all that applied due to lack of space. In fact we had to start a night shift. This will take a lot of dedication and hours from the instructors and apprentices some of them will be doing six days a week 10-hour days. To the graduating class of 2024, Congratulations I'm sure it's been a long 5 years for you, but you made it. Never stop educating yourself, keep your certs up to date and always better yourself, you have the support of this membership behind you.

## Business Agent's Report

### *Jon Wooten*



First I'd like to congratulate our retiring Business Manager Mark Swaner. You've given 44 years of service to our Local and left it better than you found it. Also, congratulations to our newly appointed Business Manager Troy Bennett and FST Todd Boland. We are growing at a rapid pace and have a lot of work to do. The newly appointed Field Representative Adam Bennett and I have been working together and bringing him up to speed with dispatching and helping the membership. Adam has been a solid addition and will do a great job in his new role.

As we roll into July work has held strong locally and on the road. Entek has finished the deep underground on building 1 and the crew has moved out waiting on the shell and core to be completed. At that point Freitag will move back in and start the underground plumbing. We are still waiting to hear word on the bids coming in for the mechanical and process piping packages. Entek and the Wabash Valley Building Trades are close to finalizing a PLA. We are scheduled to vote on the finalized PLA on 7/3. Freitag also continues to stay busy at several local school house renovations that will last the summer. Sun Mechanical was successful on the bid for the HVAC package at the new Amazon warehouse in the Industrial Park. They are based out of Chicago and are considering subbing this out to a local contractor. Unfortunately the HVAC is 99% electric and will not require much piping at all. B&S Plumbing has completed the underground there at Amazon and has pulled off the project. They will return later this Summer to start the above ground. A sizeable fab package is currently being bid at Marathon Oil Refinery that would require the addition of 40-50 hands for a year. I will keep you updated as info on that bid becomes available. Marathon has several major maintenance projects scheduled for 2025. AA Huber was successful in bidding the new student housing building at Rose Hulman. I will do a pre-job with their PM this month and manpower needs will be ironed out.

Work in the Northern jurisdiction has picked up since Purdue let out for graduation. Summer remodeling is in full swing as utilities can be shut down and improvements can be made. Fluid Technologies has several projects across campus with remodels, new construction and will be busy for several years. A&R Mechanical is bringing out the utilities for Hillenbrand from the existing building to the new addition. The new dining hall at Hillenbrand will need to be turned over for the new school year. DA Dodd has hired a few this summer for projects in Tippecanoe County. BMWC and A&R are busy at the new Rolls Royce. Hiring will pick up for A&R at Rolls in the coming weeks for welders, licensed plumbers and apprentices. I have been in constant contact with the corporate office at SK Hynix on the new 3.8 billion \$ chip packaging plant in West Lafayette. Very little information has been released since they first announced this massive addition to West Lafayette.

Travel work has remained steady and we have been very fortunate to have this much work within driving distance. The next big push for manpower will be at Local 189 Columbus Ohio and 553 Kansas City. Welders, Plumbers and Certified Riggers will be at a premium for the next 5 years. If anyone isn't working and looking for a job give me a call.

## Retiring Business Manager's Report

July's Piping Industry News will be my last article as the Business Manager of the Plumbers & Steamfitters local 157.

First thing to talk about is the signed and ratified contract with the MCA of the Wabash Valley. This is by far the largest financial package for Local 157 and many other locals around the country. We ended up with \$11.50 over the next three years. This is how it breaks down; July 2024 - \$4.00 which will put the total package at \$66.22, January 2025 - \$1.00, total package \$67.22, July 2025, \$1.75 total package \$68.97, January 2026 \$1.50 total package \$70.47, July 2026 \$1.75 total package 72.22, January 2027, \$1.50 total package \$73.72. As of July 1, 2024 Journey scale is \$44.45. We were also able to raise the 3rd through 5th year apprentices by 5%. Fringe Benefit Contributions are \$0.40 National Pension, \$0.15 Health & Welfare and \$0.30 to the Educational Trust.

***At this time I would like to thank the membership of Local 157 for putting their trust in me as your Business Manager for the last seven and a half years, it has been a great honor to serve as Business Manager of the finest Local in the UA.***

They will be making announcements in the next month or so. Entek has secured their financing and has committed to use local labor and vendors. In addition, there is another major project coming to the Cayuga powerhouse.

In the next few weeks we will be swearing in 160 plus new apprentices. This is the largest apprentice class in the history of Local 157.

## From the Educational Trust Department of Plumbers & Steamfitters Local 157

We have 3 AWP Classes going on, 1 in Lafayette with 10 Students and 2 in Terre Haute, 1 Day Class in Terre Haute with 10 Students and 1 night Class with 17 Students. We started with 44 total students and we now have 37 left.

We currently have 166 new Apprentices to sign up and start classes this August. 42 of them being in the Lafayette Area and 124 of them being in the Terre Haute Area. That will bring Local 157's total Apprenticeship numbers to 406 Apprentices. 105 of those Apprentices in the Lafayette School and 301 at the Terre Haute School. Back in 2022 our total number was 118. So in 2 years time we have more then tripled our Apprentice numbers and that has also more then tripled the amount of money it takes to train Our Apprentices. Starting this Fall our Classes will run 6 days a week instead of 4 to be able to house them all.

We will have an OSHA 30 and Industrial Rigging Class starting on August 26th. The Indiana Plumbing Code Class will be October 10th and the Backflow Prevention will start on Jan 20th, 2025, Med Gas on March 3rd, Instrumentation Level 1 on May 5th and Level 2 on June 30th. These are all Classes to obtain Certifications. If any Journeyman is interested in taking any of these Classes please contact me by phone at (812) 877-1736.

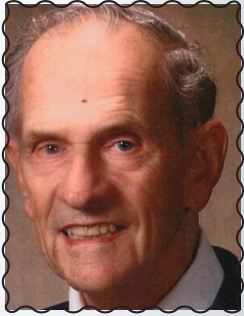
During the months of April, May, and June 2024, your Health and Welfare Plan staff processed 27,849 claims, totaling \$11,749,824.13.

In this article, I would like to highlight a few of the not-so-obvious items considered qualified expenses reimbursable under your HRA. **1.** Over the counter medications like aspirin, pain medications, allergy medications, etc.; **2.** Breast pumps & Accessories, Infertility treatments and menstrual products; **3.** Dental charges including Orthodontics, Dentures and premiums; **4.** Vision correction such as surgery to treat defective vision, (like laser eye surgery or radial keratotomy), premiums, eyeglasses and contact lenses needed for medical reasons as well as the cost of equipment and materials required for using contact lenses, such as saline solution and enzyme cleaner; **5.** Health & Welfare, Medicare B, Medicare Advantage, Medicare Supplements and individual health insurance premiums, and; **6.** Hearing Aids, batteries, repairs and maintenance needed to operate them. If you are still working and think you need hearing aids, please contact the fund office first, as a more cost-effective option may be available. You can find the entire list of qualified, reimbursable expenses and detailed information on HRA's in the IRS' Publication 502. You can find this booklet online. You will find a copy of the HRA guidelines and the HRA Reimbursement Request Form on the Plan's website at: <http://www.pthwplan.org/supp.asp>. Please remember that the total of claims submitted must equal \$200 or more to be eligible for reimbursement.

To clear up a little bit of confusion regarding your balances, they **CAN** be carried over year after year. You will only forfeit the balance in the HRA **IF** your coverage under the Pipe Trades Health & Welfare Plan terminates and there is no activity (**contributions OR reimbursements**) for a period of 36 months. Otherwise, it will be there for you to use for eligible reimbursements throughout your career or for paying your monthly premiums when short on hours or at retirement.

Please contact the fund office with additional questions regarding the HRA or to inquire on your current balance.

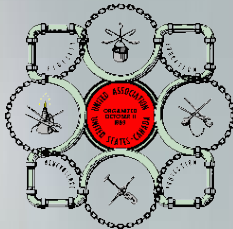

Having the right care provider can have a positive impact on your health and well-being. Choosing one in your plan's network also saves you money.

Our online **Find Care** tool at [anthem.com](https://www.anthem.com) and the **Sydney<sup>SM</sup> Health app** includes a search function to locate doctors, hospitals, labs, durable medical equipment (DME), and other care providers in your plan's network. If you use a care provider or facility that's not in your plan's network, your part of the cost will be higher and your care may not be covered.

## How to find care in your plan's network

- 1 Go to [anthem.com/find-care](https://www.anthem.com/find-care) (or open the **Sydney Health app** and select the care icon at the bottom).
- 2 There are two ways to search:
  - For a **personalized search** — if you haven't already, create your account using the **register now** link. If you've already created your account, choose **Log In to Find Care** and enter your username and password.
  - For a **basic search** without logging in — you can use either your member ID number listed on your health plan ID card or your three-digit alpha prefix, "PTO."
- 3 Enter the city, county, or ZIP code of the area you are seeking care.
- 4 Search for a:
  - **Care provider** by name or specialty. Once you enter your search criteria, you will be able to filter by:
    - Distance
    - Gender
    - Languages spoken
    - Subspecialty
  - **Hospital** by name or procedure type.
  - **Lab** by city, county, or ZIP code. Whether a lab is "in network" depends on the location of the doctor who ordered the test. Please search location using the doctor's city, county, or ZIP code.
  - **DME** by city, county, or ZIP code of the area where you are shipping or purchasing. Whether a DME supplier is "in network" depends on where the equipment will be shipped or where it was purchased (if purchased at a retail location).
